- B. <u>Analysis</u>: In this section of the test, you will be asked to perform the following types of writing analysis:
 - a. You will need to identify a paragraph's structure using Nash's typology of paragraph structure.
 - b. You will need to identify and map the argumentative structure of a short text.
 - c. You will need to identify and correct sentence fragments and run-ons.
- C. Writing Exercise: In this section of the test, you will be given a topic and asked to write either an analytical, argumentative, comparative, or descriptive essay. Although you will not write the actual essay, you will need to produce the following evidence: brainstorming, graphic of preliminary organization (outline), and a thesis sentence (narrowed topic, problem, cue/framework/map).
