 - 4. Compare and contrast the biographies and personalities of Hiram Bingham and Mark Adams. What characteristics do they share? How are they different?
 - 5. Why can we consider *Turn Right at Machu Picchu* both a serious and also humorous travelogue? Explain in depth, including at least two examples for each categorization.
